Domestic violence

Domestic violence is violence that occurs within a marriage, partnership or family – or between people who are separated and no longer live together. Domestic violence occurs in all groups in our society, completely irrespective of income, education, age, etc.

These are the different types of domestic violence:

PHYSICAL VIOLENCE

Hitting with or without an object, pushing, shaking, biting, throttling, tying someone up, throwing things at them, and ranging from physical assaults to homicides.

SEXUAL VIOLENCE

This ranges from forcing someone to perform sexual acts to rape.

SOCIAL VIOLENCE

Restricting someone's social life, for example, by domineering, imposing prohibitions, rigorously controlling their contact with family members or with persons outside the family, or by locking them up.

VIOLENCE TOWARDS CHILDREN

Many experts only apply the term 'domestic violence' to partnerships between adults. In cases of violence towards children and adolescents, a distinction is drawn between physical, sexualised and mental violence. Even when children or adolescents 'only' witness domestic violence, it has a detrimental effect on the wellbeing of the child.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE – IT HELPS TO SPEAK OUT!

Are you experiencing domestic violence? Or are you worried about a person in your neighbourhood or your social environment? Then you can help by breaking the silence!

The services offered by the Potsdam advice centres are meant for everyone who has experienced violence, regardless of their age, educational level, sexual orientation, social status or cultural origin, and regardless of the time or type of violence they have experienced.

The aim of the Victim Protection Working Group is to improve the support structures for victims of violence.

PSYCHOLOGICAL VIOLENCE

Serious threats, coercion, deprivation of liberty or stalking a separated partner. Subjecting someone to contempt, insults, humiliation, feelings of guilt, intimidation or verbal abuse also count as psychological violence.

ECONOMIC VIOLENCE

Forbidding or forcing someone to work, confiscating their wages, or one person in a couple having sole control of the financial resources.
