Block V

In May 2021, Potsdam's city council ended the moratorium on the residential building "Staudenhofwohnhaus" (Am Alten Markt 10) that had existed until then. The council's decision was based on an analysis of variants regarding the economic viability of redevelopment versus demolition and a new building. This paves the way for the redevelopment of a mixed-use residential and commercial quarter in Block V. Construction will be carried out by ProPotsdam GmbH, the previous owner of "Staudenhofwohnhaus".

The building structure, use and design of the new development are based on the specifications of the Leitbautenkonzept for Potsdam' city centre. The building at the southwestern corner of the block facing Alter Markt will be built with the historic façade of the predecessor building (a so-called "landmark façade"). The model for the historic building was a design by the Italian architect Palladio for the "Palazzo Giulio Capra" in Vicenza, which, however, was never built.

The future development is mainly intended to provide needsoriented and, above all, affordable housing. In order to achieve this goal, it is reviewed which flat sizes and layouts are particularly needed. Funds from the Brandenburg's housing promotion scheme will be used to enable affordable rents. There will be room for new stores, cafés and restaurants on the ground floor. In this way, the place "Alter Markt" will continue to be filled with life, both for new residents, retailers, businesspeople as well as for visitors.

Preparing the development plan SAN-P 20 "Am Alten Markt/ Am Kanal" will create the legal basis for the implementation of the now defined redevelopment goals in accordance with zoning and planning law. The development of Block V north of St. Nicolas Church completes the implementation of the landmark building concept and thus the urban redevelopment around Alter Markt.

Block IV

Unlike Block III, the future twelve new buildings in Block IV will be built by "only" four contractors. Two of them were selected directly on the basis of a resolution by Potsdam's city councillors. To the west of the Bildungsforum, the municipal housing association ProPotsdam is building new houses with flats that are subject to rent and occupancy control as well as space for supplementary use by the Bildungsforum. To the east, the state of Brandenburg will build a new innercity student dormitory together with Studentenwerk Potsdam.

In May 2021, two concepts were selected from twelve applications in a selection process for the two southern plots along Erika-Wolf-Strasse (historically Schwertfegerstrasse). These two building contractors also undertake to offer part of the flats that will be built as rent and occupancy-controlled housing for a period of 30 years.

As in Blocks I - III, clear specifications must be met in terms of design. The exact appearance of the houses will be determined in architectural competitions. The first designs will be finalized and presented to the public in the first half of 2022. Construction is expected to start by the end of 2023.



Block III

A new city quarter is being established where once was the entrance to the university of applied sciences. The foundation stone for the so-called Block III was laid on 2 September 2021.

After the archaeological excavations were completed, twelve-meter-long bulkheads were first pressed into the ground before successively preparing the excavation pit, which is up to five meters deep. Since the fall of 2021, the buildings have been growing.

The structural work will be completed in 2022 and the Alter Markt square will get back its former western edge. From the end of 2022, work will begin on the façades, which are of particular importance.

During the planning phase and also during the construction works, the quality of construction and materials will be coordinated. This particularly applies to the two southern corner buildings, which are being rebuilt as so-called landmark façades in the design of the historic predecessor buildings (the inn "Plöger'scher Gasthof" and town house Knobelsdorffhaus).

In addition to private developers, the two Potsdam cooperatives "PWG 1956" and "Karl Marx" are building there. According to the current status, a total of almost 100 flats will be built in Block III by six building contractors in 14 buildings. 19 of these flats will be rent and occupancy-controlled with funds from the Brandenburg's housing promotion scheme. Another 62 flats will be offered at 10% below the rent index.

The ground-floor areas of the buildings will feature various stores, a "House of Music" and restaurants to ensure that Potsdam's city centre continues to be an interesting place for Potsdam's citizens and visitors.

Block II

In the comparatively small Block II on the western side of Friedrich-Ebert-Strasse, the building with a so-called landmark façade of the predecessor building destroyed in World War II was restored at the end of 2021. The design of the "Achteckenhaus" (Octagonal House) tells about the history of the formerly very small plots of land between 1771 and 1779. Other examples of this typical "redesign" by King Frederick II. in the baroque period can be seen not far away in Charlottenstrasse. The king's aim was to make the formerly small bourgeois houses appear larger and more splendid to the outside by means of façades covering several plots of land.

The adjacent building "Haus Einsiedel" (Einsiedel House) celebrated its topping-out ceremony in September 2021. The house is scheduled for completion by the end of 2022. Flats and a branch of the savings bank Mittelbrandenburgische Sparkasse will be built there.

The foundation stone for the new Potsdam Synagogue was laid in Schlossstrasse on 8 November 2021. The decision to build a new synagogue at this location dates back to the early 2000s. The state of Brandenburg is the builder of this complex and currently expects to complete it by the end of 2023.







Dear Residents of Potsdam. Dear Visitors and Guests.

The cityscape of Potsdam has changed tremendously during the past three decades. While urban redevelopment and renewal seems to be almost completed in many parts of Potsdam, the dynamics of change continue in its city centre. Foundation stones are laid, cranes are turning, buildings are rising, toppingout ceremonies and inaugurations are celebrated. The goal of reapproaching the historic layout of the city, which was decided by the city council in 1990, is getting closer.

In the redevelopment area Potsdam City Centre, a guarter for living, working and housing is growing. Flats are being built to meet a variety of needs and requirements in terms of size. amenities and rents. In an extensive award process, we have placed great emphasis on creating a vital neighbourhood that reflects Potsdam's population structure. There will be flats for students, rent-controlled flats, but also condominiums and rental flats in the upper price segment. Another special aspect is the participation of Potsdam housing cooperatives The "Potsdamer Wohnungsbaugenossenschaft 1956" and the housing cooperative "Karl Marx" are building houses for Potsdam's citizens, just as ProPotsdam GmbH.

In 2021, we inaugurated the redesigned Plantage as an innercity green, play and recreation area. In the immediate vicinity, the work on another major construction project will begin in 2022: the Potsdam Kreativ Quartier. Starting in 2024, space for creative professionals will be created here in the first construction phase "Langer Stall" (Long Stables) - an important impulse for the city's creative and cultural scene.

Compared to the past two years, there will be significantly more construction activity around the square Alter Markt and the Plantage in 2022. You can watch the new houses growing. The synagogue will also become visible this year and finally turn from a much-discussed conceptual idea into structural reality. Let our leaflet inspire you to participate in the growth



Colonnade Ringerkolonnade at the Square Steubenplatz

Since April 2016, the Ringerkolonnade, which once separated the royal pleasure garden from the bourgeois city with its transparent architecture, has been back at its historic location. After the structure was partially destroyed in 1945. part of the colonnade was largely rebuilt from original parts at the harbour basin in 1970.

The stone-conserving renovation that began in 2015 due to the problematic structural condition of the colonnade was used to bring the rows of columns back to Steubenplatz. The partially new column bases and drums can still be identified today. In recent years, the stored eponymous wrestling sculptures, vases and putti, which were also in need of restoration, have been refurbished. In April 2019, the first vase and putti group returned to the roof of the colonnade. It was fully crowned in the summer of 2021.

Only a few months later, the first wrestling sculptures followed: the "Swordsman" and the "Slinger". Only the two pairs of wrestlers of the rebuilt part are missing now to complete the colonnade. The return of the sculptures was possible thanks to a strong civic commitment within the Deutsche Stiftung Denkmalschutz (German Foundation for the Protection of Historic Monuments).

The structure no longer has a separating effect. Time and again, passers-by appreciate the opportunity to enjoy the sun between the columns and in the company of the silent gentlemen made of sandstone and to let urban life pass by.

On 19 August 2021, the 2nd construction phase of the Plantage was inaugurated with a large celebration. The area has now been redesigned and can be experienced almost in its historical dimension. It offers all visitors play, sports and exercise opportunities. The circular trail along the Small Plantage invites for a leisurely walk. Both the newly planted trees and the numerous perennial plants show a magnificent play of colours in their leaves and blossoms any time of the year. The stone wall made of concrete blocks, which used to serve merely as a kerbstone for a car park, has also been renovated and integrated into the area of the former computer centre. Thus, this piece of art by Karl-Heinz Adler and Friedrich Kracht is again given more significance.

The redesign clearly upgrades the area as a green inner-city space. It is based on the winning design by hutterreimann landscape architects (Berlin) of the landscape planning competition held in 2016. The design combines the historical features of Peter Joseph Lenné with modern elements adapted to the needs of today's users.

It is expected that the remaining areas of the Plantage can be finally established in 2024 after completion of the Kreativ Quartier.

The Plantage

Five modern, stand-alone buildings and the central neighbourhood square will be built according to the concept of a "village" inside the block - so to speak, an urban, green and inspiring village for working, living and meeting. The "green" quarter is marked by green roofs and façades, the use of photovoltaics and climate-friendly building materials to implement a high ecological standard. In addition, the quarter is geared to pedestrians and cyclists.
